Dear Mr. Woodruff,

I am writing to bring to your attention to a concern that Justin is not being served well by the Court in charge of his planned return to his father. Justin has been living in a foster home since he was five years old. When he arrived he was hitting, biting and kicking others as well as [REDACTED] the room. He additionally demonstrated [REDACTED] behaviors. He has been in therapy on almost a constant basis since then.

He has been evaluated by psychologist Michael O'Leary PhD and has been a client of Dr. Joe Jenson a certified [REDACTED] treatment provider. Dr. Jenson was involved because Justin was engaging in non-age appropriate [REDACTED] behaviors. Both Psychologists recommended that Justin not return to his father's care.

Last summer Justin started having counseling visits with his father and therapist Racheal Hardies.

Initially Justin liked the visits, thought he [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Several months ago he began having unsupervised visits with his father leading to overnight visits in his father's home. His behaviors have deteriorated dramatically.

In school last year Justin had a para educator throughout his school day and by the end of the year he appeared ready to function out extra assistance. This year his behavior has deteriorated and he has at times, two para educators working with him. He has become increasingly aggressive at school and was recently sent home from school because [REDACTED]. He will not be allowed to return to school until he has been evaluated by a mental health provider to determine if he is a threat to others in his school.

His attendance has been poor after visiting his father. His foster parents report that he is exhausted. He states that he cannot sleep at his fathers' home and that he has difficulty controlling his upsetting thoughts. Due to numerous absences he has been referred to Truancy Court.

[REDACTED] While [REDACTED] did not repeat this to the police, Justin [REDACTED]. I have made several recommendations that he return to Dr. Jenson but he has not seen him.

Justin has been in a serious decline at least since he began having overnight visits with his father. Though when he first began having therapy sessions he was becoming increasingly aggressive. I have asked that he be referred again to Dr. Jenson on several occasions with no response. I have asked that at a minimum visits be less frequent so that Justin has time to recover before he has to manage the psychological stresses of contact with his father. Justin was traumatized early in his life and now he is being re traumatized. His behaviors reflect a boy in decline unable to manage the stresses in his life and I believe the court is not properly protecting him.

I am asking that you look into this matter and give consideration to recommending that the court respond in Justin's interests by ordering sessions with Dr. Jenson and reducing visits to once per month so that Justin can have time to recover from the stresses that he experiences when with his father.
